SHOW RULES

- 1. All shows are open to members and non-members alike.
- 2. All exhibits to be own work, or grown by the exhibitor in fruit, vegetable and flower classes (excluding class N32 in the November Show). Varieties should be named.
- 3. An exhibitor may stage no more than three exhibits in each class, except at the discretion of the Show Manager.
- 4. Juniors may exhibit in an adult class.
- 5. Exhibitors may use their own vases.
- 6. Plates are provided and must be used where specified.
- 7. Exhibitors must accept the space allotted to them by the Show Manager.
- 8. The decision of the judges will be final.
- 9. Exhibits must not be removed before the presentation of the trophies.
- 10. All prizes will be paid out not later than 4.00 pm on the day of the show.
- 11. Exhibits can be staged from 6.00 pm 8.30 pm on Friday and 8.30 am 11.15 am on Saturday. Judging starts promptly at 12 noon.
- 12. Judging to NCS, NVS and NDS rules where applicable.
- 13. In the interests of the Society the Committee reserves the right to add classes on the day of a show. Judges will be advised prior to judging.
- 14. Points awarded: $1^{st} = 3$ points, $2^{nd} = 2$ points, $3^{rd} = 1$ point.
